Andrew Lindsay Adams passed away peacefully on October 24, 2025 after a battle with cancer. He was 49 years old and will be dearly missed.

Andrew was born on August 11, 1976 in Dallas, Texas, the youngest child of Henry Dickson Adams and Marsha Daniel Adams. Andrew was a graduate of Lake Highlands High School. Andrew's childhood was spent doing scouts, where he earned the rank of Eagle Scout, and hanging out with his best friends, Lance and Ryan. His friendly, generous, and warm-hearted nature won him new friends wherever he went.

Andrew worked for the family business learning the ins and outs of the air conditioning business at the Electromotive Corporation. He eventually moved over to Lowes then Barsco where he developed a vast knowledge of inventory, parts, and chemicals. He spent the last four and a half years working for old family friends, the Dunigans, at A Brite Company, which has been a blessing.

Andrew loved biking, boating, bowling, watching car races, and spending time with family and old neighborhood friends. He always made time to visit his big brother and family in Houston.
